

SERVICE DELIVERY AND BUDGET IMPLEMENTATION PLAN (SDBIP)

2026/27 FINANCIAL YEAR

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1. INTRODUCTION AND OVERVIEW

The Service Delivery and Budget Implementation Plan (SDBIP) serves as a critical mechanism for ensuring alignment between the Municipality's Integrated Development Plan (IDP) and its approved Budget. It provides a framework for translating the strategic objectives contained in the IDP into measurable service delivery commitments and facilitates the monitoring, evaluation, and reporting of municipal performance throughout the financial year.

The IDP is the Municipality's principal five-year strategic planning instrument and guides all planning, budgeting, management, and decision-making processes. It promotes the integration and coordination of programmes and projects within the Municipality and across all spheres of government, thereby supporting sustainable development and improved service delivery. The priorities and objectives identified in the IDP inform the allocation of municipal resources and the development of annual performance plans.

The SDBIP comprises a detailed one-year implementation plan that outlines the Municipality's key performance indicators (KPIs), quarterly performance targets, and budget allocations. It provides a direct link between the approved Budget and the delivery of municipal services by establishing measurable performance expectations and accountability mechanisms.

To enhance understanding and consistency in performance measurement, the document includes supplementary schedules containing KPI definitions, and calculation formulas. In addition, a separate schedule identifies those indicators on which the Municipality is currently unable to report due to budgetary, system-related, or data availability constraints. These indicators are supported by detailed action plans that outline the corrective measures and interventions required to address the identified challenges and strengthen future reporting capabilities.

The SDBIP further incorporates the compliance indicators and assessment questions prescribed in MFMA Circular 88 for planning, monitoring, and reporting purposes. In addition, a dedicated schedule reflects the Municipal Systems Act (MSA) Regulation 10 prescribed indicators that are not specifically accommodated within the MFMA Circular 88 framework, thereby ensuring comprehensive legislative compliance.

To facilitate effective financial monitoring and ensure alignment with the approved IDP and Budget, the SDBIP also includes monthly revenue and expenditure projections, annual cash flow forecasts, a three-year Capital Works Plan, and a Capital Budget by Ward.

The SDBIP consists of two distinct layers. The upper layer, commonly referred to as the municipal scorecard, is submitted to the Executive Mayor for approval and to Council for noting. This layer contains the Municipality's strategic performance indicators and targets and forms the basis for organisational performance monitoring and reporting. The lower layer applies to directorates and forms the foundation of the performance plans and performance agreements of Executive Directors, Directors, and other relevant officials. It contains additional operational indicators that support the achievement of the strategic indicators reflected in the upper layer. Executive Directors and Directors are responsible for developing and managing these performance plans in consultation with their respective departments to ensure alignment with municipal objectives and service delivery priorities.

2. LEGISLATIVE FRAMEWORK

The development and implementation of a Service Delivery and Budget Implementation Plan (SDBIP) are prescribed by the Local Government: Municipal Finance Management Act, 56 of 2003 (MFMA). The MFMA promotes sound financial management and accountability within municipalities and requires municipalities to establish mechanisms for implementing and monitoring their approved budgets. In terms of section 53(1)(c)(ii) of the MFMA, an SDBIP is defined as a detailed plan approved by the Mayor of a municipality for implementing the delivery of municipal services and the execution of the municipality's annual budget.

Section 53 of the MFMA requires that the SDBIP must include:

- (a) projections for each month of—
 - (i) revenue to be collected by source; and
 - (ii) operational and capital expenditure by vote;
- (b) service delivery targets and performance indicators for each quarter; and
- (c) any other matters that may be prescribed.

The SDBIP serves as a key management, implementation, and monitoring tool, enabling the Municipality to monitor progress against planned service delivery objectives and budget commitments throughout the financial year. It further provides a basis for assessing organisational performance and ensuring accountability to Council, the community, and other stakeholders.

In accordance with section 53(1)(c)(ii) of the MFMA, the Executive Mayor is required to approve the SDBIP within 28 days after the approval of the annual Budget. Furthermore, section 53(3)(a) requires that the approved SDBIP be made public within 14 days after its approval to promote transparency and accountability in municipal governance.

3. SDBIP CYCLE

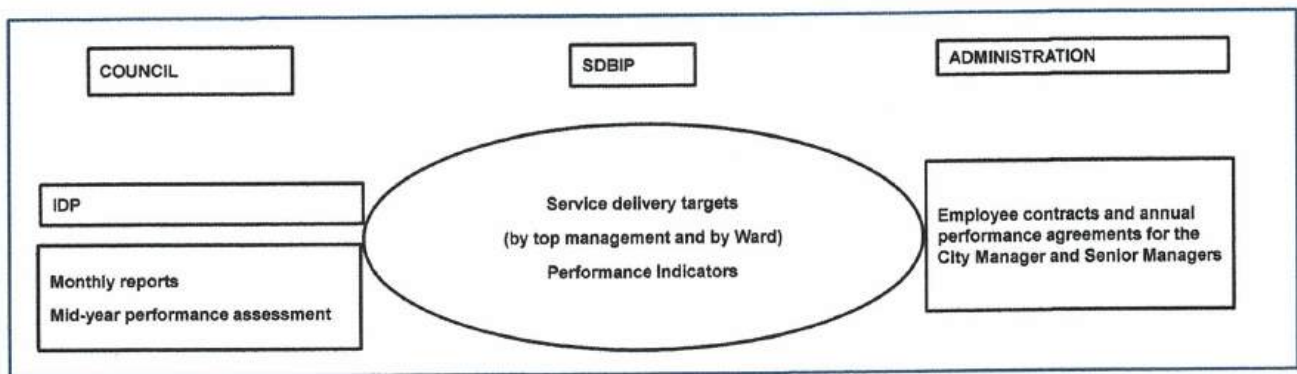

The SDBIP constitutes a contract between the Administration, Council, and the community. It ensures that all role players are working towards the same objectives, as articulated in the Integrated Development Plan (IDP). The SDBIP provides a clear focus on inputs, outputs, and outcomes, thereby strengthening performance management and accountability across the Municipality.

It enables senior managers to monitor the performance of their subordinates; the City Manager to monitor the performance of senior managers; the Executive Mayor to monitor the performance of the City Manager; the Council to monitor the performance of the Administration; and the community to monitor the performance of the Council.

The SDBIP therefore serves as a management and implementation plan rather than a policy proposal.

4. PERFORMANCE REPORTING

To enhance performance assessment, accountability, monitoring and evaluation, reporting requirements are outlined below:

10. REVENUE AND EXPENDITURE PROJECTIONS

These projections serve as an important financial management and monitoring tool, enabling the Municipality to track performance against planned revenue and expenditure levels throughout the year. Regular monitoring facilitates the early identification of variances and emerging trends, thereby enabling management to implement appropriate corrective actions and interventions timeously to ensure the achievement of the Municipality's financial and service delivery objectives.
